- If you are absent on your presentation date, you MUST be prepared to present upon the first day of your return to class. If you are not prepared upon your return, you will receive a grade of zero.
- If you are unprepared on your presentation date, you MUST be prepared to present on the next day of class. You will lose -20% of your grade, which will reduce it by two whole letter grades! If you are not prepared to present on your scheduled late presentation date, you will receive a grade of zero.
- If your presentation is not audible, and Mrs. Dawson and the students in the back of the classroom cannot hear you she will politely ask you to speak up. Failure to speak up after a second request (strike 3) will result in your having to report to present in front of Mrs. Dawson during WIN Time, where there will be a smaller class. You will lose -30% of your grade, which means that if your presentation meets 100% of the rubric criterion, the highest grade you will earn is 70%.
